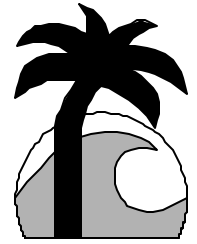

## Park Manager's Report

At the beginning of the New Year a lot of folks take time to reflect on the year that was. I personally like to keep looking forward at things to come. In the upcoming year we have a lot to look forward to at both Honeymoon Island and Caladesi Island.

The contracts have been signed and construction is ready to begin on the Nature Center. The initial phases will be demolition of parts of the old building and then the new construction of much of the building's interior.

We will be completing the last parts of the design phase for the exhibits and soon Wilderness Graphics will start the construction of exhibits so that they will be ready to install once the building is complete. We look forward to completion by mid-summer.

The Friends have decided to tackle the Island Fest event on their own. Committees are forming and plans are being made for the event, which will take place on May 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. One of the highlights of the event will be a larger Osprey Village. ## Volunteer News

Being a volunteer in Florida State Parks has many advantages! One of them is that volunteers are covered under Workers Compensation. I have always volunteered somewhere and when I first started my job here, I was pleasantly surprised to hear of this policy. This was the first time I had heard of volunteers being compensated if they were to get hurt on the job. It really makes sense and I

think that it makes volunteers feel even more valued and part of the staff. How does that apply to CSO members? An example might be that you are working a special event and get injured; you would be eligible for compensation as long as you were working within the guidelines of the volunteer program. Also, since many CSO members are also regular volunteers in the park, they may come in contact with hazards such as poison ivy or hand tools. If you do get hurt while in your volunteer role with the park there are some basic things to remember:

- Be sure to have a staff member or designated volunteer "check you out" on equipment before use. (Just because you have used similar equipment elsewhere does not mean you should not be checked out on equipment. Different models can vary in operation methods.)
- If you are uncomfortable or have never used certain equipment, say so and get training and become familiar with the owner's manual
- Wear the required Personal Protection Equipment and follow all safety guidelines
- If you do happen to get injured, notify a staff member immediately and document the incident so that you can be covered for doctor's visits or medications.

Finally, always work safely and smartly and you will not have to take advantage of this benefit! If you have further questions about this policy, please don't hesitate to contact me. You can also refer to the *Volunteer Handbook*. Thank you for all that you do to support our parks!

## 2005 Overview

### **Events**

- In March the park hosted the **13th Annual Mutt Strut** sponsored by the Humane Society of Pinellas. It drew 1100 people and 475 dogs and raised \$75,000 for the Humane Society. The park benefits from the entrance fees!

“Preserving and protecting the state’s natural resources takes great commitment,” said DEP Secretary Colleen M. Castille. “Florida’s citizens can help make a positive impact in 2006 by adopting environmentally-friendly practices.” To help you get started, here are ten simple resolutions that will make 2006 cleaner and greener.

**Conserve energy.** Conduct an energy audit on your home to determine areas for improvement. Energy specialists can identify areas where you can save energy at little or no cost.

**Bike, walk, bus or carpool at least one day a week.** Explore alternative means for transportation to protect Florida’s air quality. Clean air is important to our health and our environment.

**Recycle wisely.** Buying products made of recycled content helps maintain the market value of recyclable materials. To learn more about recycling visit [www.floridadep.org/waste](http://www.floridadep.org/waste).

**Build it green.** Reduce impact from remodeling or building a new home by recycling your construction waste, using re-claimed building materials, using less toxic materials, paints and finishes, and designing your project to conserve energy.

**Compost leftover food.** Composting is an easy way to reduce the amount of garbage produced per household.

**Conserve water.** Check bathroom fixtures for leaks and plan for a more efficient summer irrigation.

**Handle hazardous waste properly.** Reduce or eliminate use of chemicals and pesticides to fertilize lawns and gardens. Garden naturally and take leftover hazardous waste to County household collection centers free of charge.

**Volunteer in your community.** The tireless efforts of volunteers play a vital role in protecting and conserving Florida’s natural resources. Help maintain and preserve the state’s greenways and trails, parks and coastal areas.

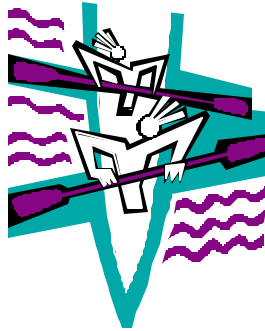

## Looking Ahead to 2006

### **3rd Annual Caladesi Kayak Challenge**

Join us Saturday, March 25, 2006 for the **3rd Annual Caladesi Kayak Challenge**. This is a great event for paddlers of all ages and abilities. The last two years we have had good weather, close races, and lots of fun.



There are two race routes: one is 4 miles and the other is 8 miles. Each race includes quite a few boat, age, and men's/women's divisions.

Register early (by March 16) to take advantage of the \$20 per paddler fee. All registrations from March 17 until the race are \$25 per paddler. Register by mail by visiting the Friends web site at [www.islandparks.org](http://www.islandparks.org) to print a form, or register online at [www.active.com](http://www.active.com). Day of race registration begins at 8:00 a.m. All paddlers must attend the race meeting at 9:15 a.m. The race begins at 9:30 a.m.

So come on out to find out how fast and how far you can paddle or to cheer on the racers. We hope to see you there.

### **Island Fest 2006**

**Island Fest** is by far the biggest undertaking by the Friends and park staff. It is our principal fund raiser and has become a local area favorite event. In previous years this event was co-sponsored by the Dunedin Chamber of Commerce (which also shared in the proceeds). The Chamber has decided not to participate this year so the Friends will be the exclusive "party planners" for this year's bash. This change necessitates some differences in the event but the overall look will be the same as in past successful editions. We have a new theme – "Celebrate with Friends", and new hours: Saturday, May 6 from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. and Sunday, May 7 from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

The emphasis this year will be more "eco-friendly" with an infusion of environmental vendors to complement the regular food and craft vendors. Osprey Village will take on a more prominent role with a bigger and more centrally located presence.

The beauty and benefits of the whole park will be emphasized with guided tours and transportation to key park features outside of the festival area.
